#### What Are you Hoping to Do? Examples:

#### Conservation

#### Soil, Water, Wildlife, Profitability

□ I want to improve the quality of my soil



□ I want to reduce water usage



□ I want to improve wildlife and/or pollinator habitat on my farm





#### Conservation Stewardship Program

Rewarding farmers and ranchers for advanced conservation efforts on land in agricultural production.

- □ Natural Resource Conservation Service
- □ Financial & technical assistance
- □ Whole farm; comprehensive; priority concerns
- □ Active management of ongoing activities
- □ New enhancements and bundles
- □ Payment rates
- □ Renewals and continual improvement

#### What Are you Hoping to Do? Examples:

#### **Markets**

New products & markets, local & direct, food safety, advertising

□ I want: to develop a new product or a business plan from my farm's raw output

□ I want: to market my products in a new way (e.g., organic, grass-fed)

□ I want: to adopt new food safety practices in order to access new markets



#### Value-Added Producer Grants

# Helping farmers add value to what they grow through processing and marketing

- □ Rural Business & Cooperative Service
- □ **Processing** processing (e.g., milled grains, cheese); product differentiation (e.g., organic, grass-fed); commodity segregation (e.g., non-GMO, no-rBGH); local food marketing; and mid-tier value chains
- □ Planning grants; Working Capital grants
- □ Matching requirement

#### Good Agricultural Practices (GAP) Audits

Helping produce farmers certify on-farm food safety practices to access new markets and demonstrate conformance to regulatory expectations.

- □ Agricultural Marketing Service
- □ Voluntary on-farm food safety audits
- □ Food safety training and certification
- □ Produce GAP Harmonized Audit
- □ USDA GAP&GHP Audit Program
- □ Average Cost \$750
- □ Group GAP

#### What Are you Hoping to Do? Examples:

### Risk Management

#### Insurance, disaster, & crop loss

- □ I want to insure my crops and/or animals against losses
- ☐ I want basic protection, but traditional crop insurance isn't an option for me
- ☐ I want to insure my entire farm and/or diversified operation



#### Whole Farm Revenue Protection

#### Helping highly diversified farms manage risk.

- □ Risk Management Agency
- □ Whole farm revenue crops & livestock
- □ Every state, every county
- □ 80% premium subsidy
- □ Diversification bonus up to 7 commodities
- □ 50-85 coverage options
- □ Market costs

#### What Are you Hoping to Do? Examples:

# Infrastructure and Operating Expenses Tractors, business plans, seeds, storage, season extension

- □ I want to purchase needed farm equipment
- □ I want to cover my farm's expenses until I am paid for my crops

□ I want to invest in buildings and equipment to help me process, store, or deliver my product



## Farm Storage Facility Loans

Helping farmers build or upgrade on-farm storage and packing facilities.

- □ Farm Service Agency
- □ Food storage prior to marketing
  - Packing sheds and walk-in coolers
  - Graders, sorters, conveyers, washers, and dryers
  - Portable storage and mobile refrigeration
- □ Low interest financing
- □ Down payment

#### What Are you Hoping to Do? Examples:

#### Land

Buy, sell, lease, and transition

□ I want to buy farmland



□ I want to lease farmland

□ I want to sell or transition my farmland to a beginning or minority farmer



### Down Payment Loan Program

Helping farmers build or upgrade on-farm storage and packing facilities.

- □ Farm Service Agency (FSA)
- □ Beginning farmers + SDFR
- □ Partnership between farmer, FSA, & private lender 5%/45%/50%
- □ FSA portion 20 yrs; -4% below normal rate; \$667,000
- □ 95% guarantee




