What is a livestock guardian?










Best choice for my situation?





- LGD breeds
- Llamas
- Donkeys



Success with Livestock Guardians

- Understand how they work
- Make the right choice for your situation
- Discount the myths and misconceptions
- Provide a good environment
- Use in combination with other deterrents
- Don't commit unless you will enjoy
- Understand not a 'magic bullet"

Guardian Llamas How They Work





Advantages


- Naturally social and protective
- No extended training or socialization
- Immediate protection
- Naturally aggressive towards canines
- Similar shelter and food as stock
- Don't challenge fencing or dig
- Not usually a threat to humans
- Quiet
- Long lifetime



Disadvantages

- Also a prey animal
- Not protective against some predators
- Do not protect family or farm
- Less successful on large pastures, dense vegetation, extreme heat and humidity
- Cannot be used with dogs
- Can be dangerous to humans or stock
- Need specialized care

How to Select Alertness, Leadership, Weight



Guardian Llama Care



- Food
- Shelter
- Fences
- Feet
- Teeth
- Fleece
- Medical care



Bringing Home a Llama

- Be prepared with shelter, fencing, catch pen
- Pen llama with stock in small area for several days
- If stock is very upset, pen next to llama and feed along common fence line
- Don't give llama too much attention
- Monitor birthing and breeding times for first year

Guardian Donkeys How They Work





Advantages

- Naturally aggressive to canines
- Territorial
- 4-6 weeks of socialization
- Similar shelter and food as stock
- Don't challenge fencing or dig
- Long lived, inexpensive
- Not usually a threat to humans
- Don't bark



Disadvantages

- Also a prey animal
- Not protective against some predators
- Danger to dogs
- Do not protect family or farm
- Not effective widely scattered stock, large pastures with dense vegetation or rough terrain, extreme cold and wet
- May bray loudly
- May harass your stock

How to Select Maturity, Size, Reaction to Dogs



Guardian Donkey Care



- Food
- Shelter
- Fences
- Feet
- Teeth
- Coat
- Medical care



Bringing Home a Donkey

- Be prepared with shelter, fencing, farrier, etc
- Minimum 4 to 6 week adjustment period
- Place next to stock in separate enclosure
- Feed along common fence line
- Later, tether with stock or release and monitor
- Increase time together if no issues
- Monitor birthing and breeding times for first year
- If needed, repeat adjustment steps or isolation technique

Livestock Guardian Dogs How They Work





Advantages

- Guard a wide variety of stock
- Guard against all predators, including aerial
- Bond to their stock, nurturing behaviors
- Will patrol and mark territory
- Can work very large and rough terrain
- Will work in pairs or packs
- Protect farm and family, alert owners
- Graduated response, self-thinker




Disadvantages

- Expense, slow to mature and train
- Need socialization and supervision
- Need good fencing, will dig
- Bark, especially at night
- Need dog food, specialized care
- Self-thinker
- May be aggressive to strangers or workers
- May be aggressive to other dogs or stock

How to Select an LGD Attentive, Protective, Trustworthy



LGD Care




- Food
- Shelter
- Fences
- Coat
- Medical care
- Handling



Bringing Home an LGD


- Be prepared with a safe enclosure
- Keep near or with stock from very beginning
- Lots of attention where dog works
- Basic training and handling
- Don't rush introductions to dogs or stock
- Supervision for 1 to 2 years
- Supervision all new situations such as birthing or breeding time, introducing new stock


