




BACKSTORY



BISON/BUFFALO FACTS

Facts about Bison

- •A bison can live 12-20 years in the wild
- •Adult males are "bulls", females are "cows", and young bison are "calves"
- •An adult bull can weight 2,000-2,2000 pounds (907-998 kg) and cows can weight 1,000 pound (454 kg)
- •A typical adult bison is 6 6.5 feet tall (1.8 2 meters) and 10 12.5 feet long (3 3.8 meters)
- Bison can run at speeds of 40 miles per hour (65 km)
- Bison can jump as high as 6 feet (1.8 meters)



WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?

WOOD BISON



- ·Bulls average 1800lbs
- Taller with a square hump
- Darker in color
- Cape usually does not form distinct boundary behind shoulder
- Long, straight hair slopping down on forehead
- Little or no chap hair on forelegs
- Smaller, more pointed beard

PLAINS BISON



- *Bulls average 1600lbs
- .Stockier with a rounded hump
- *Lighter in color
- In summer, cape forms distinct boundary behind shoulder
- Frizzy bair on head
- Chaps of long hair on forelegs
- ·Large rounded beard

FEED AND GRAZING

- Bison eat about 1.6 % of their body mass per day of dry vegetation
- Equals 24 pounds a day for a full-grown bison
- But what do the bison eat?
- Bison eat grass as the greatest percentage of their daily diet.
- 93% grass, 5% forbs, and 2% browse as averaged over the course of one year. Texas AM
- Bison will eat grain but more sensitive to grain feeding then cattle
- Also be careful with domesticated hay such as alfalfa, due to a sensitive rumen it isn't advised to have them just on those type of feeds.






- Bison tend to thrive better in larger environments
- Are more efficient in utilizing larger pastures
- Stock as if you would cattle
- Bison tend to be more efficient in utilizing grass then cattle and moving throughout a pasture better
- Very easy to train to move from one paddock or pasture to another
- Rotational Grazing

PASTURES

Stocking rate can be 2-3 cow/calf pairs, same as in cattle

On pasture a young buffalo can gain from 2.5 to 4 lbs a day.



BUFFALO AND CLIMATE CHANGE

- Are bison better for the land?
- Increased diversity
- Increased utilization
- Carbon and soil
- Harder animals adapted to harsher conditions



VACCINATIONS

- There is much debate about vaccinating buffalo
- There is no specific vaccinations for buffalo, they were developed for cattle and little to no research has been done to see how affective they are for buffalo
- Many people will vaccinate buffalo just to make their neighbors who raise cattle more comfortable
- Many people think that all buffalo have a disease called brucellosis. This is not the case, it has been eradicated in all buffalo except the herd in Yellowstone
- Some states will require a bangs (brucellosis) vaccination for buffalo to enter the state. Always check with your state veterinarian about requirements



DISEASES

- Mycroplasma Bovis
- Brucellosis
- Tuberculosis
- Anthrax
- Maliganant Catarrhal Fever (MCF) sheep
- Types of Pneumonia

OTHER HEALTH THINGS TO CONSIDER

- Copper deficiency and other mineral supplements
- Parasite control
 - External
 - Internal
- Pink Eye

GENETICS

- Pure bison? Gene pool is still very small compared to what it was
- Cattle genes
- Genetic diversity (switching bulls)



HANDLING OF BISON

- Bison are wilder and harder to contain the cattle
- Do not trust a buffalo keep your distance
- Buffalo only go where buffalo want to go
 (Convince them to go where you want them to go)
- Slow and steady for moving, much more sensitive to noises and things to spook them then cattle

FENCING

Unlike livestock fencing is a bit more complex for buffalo

- Fencing is usually 5 to 6 strands of barbed wire
- Taller posts
- Cost per foot is essential 1/3 higher than for cattle
- Cost can range from ten to fifteen thousand dollars per mile
- Adequate handling facilities for buffalo can cost fifty to seventy-five thousand dollars

Buffalo caretakers need security and support and guaranteed long-term access to land, to justify the cost of investing in a buffalo operation

PASTURES

Buffalo pastures are a unique animals when it comes to grazing

The study, conducted by Applied Ecological Services INC (AES) found that returning buffalo to the landscape improved the soil quality compared to nearby non regeneratively managed cattlegrazed pasture.



MARKETING

Online live animal auctions are trending in Buffalo country

Many sale barns don't allow for buffalo to come into their facility due to their massive size can be destructive to the equipment

OBSTACLES IN MARKETING BUFFALO PRODUCTS IN INDIAN COUNTRY

- Small or geographically-remote Tribes may struggle with marketing their products due to no USDA meat processing facilities nearby
- No state inspector available for inspection or cost may be too costly for smaller tribes
- Lack the tourism traffic to support buffalo tourism revenue-generation
- Marketing resources to reach high-end clientele who pay top dollars for the buffalo hunts






